
On 16 November 2023, at the University of Prešov, Faculty of Health Care, we joined the global Stop Pressure Ulcer Day.

At the Faculty of Health care, we prepare experts in several non-medical healthcare professions. (nurses, dental hygienists, midwifes, paramedics, radiology medical technicians, technicians, laboratory physiotherapists).



We have provided students with up-to-date guidelines both for healthcare professionals and for patients themselves and their relatives in connection with pressure ulcers. At the same time, we drew attention to the possibilities for the prevention and treatment of pressure ulcer.





During the day, we addressed students and drew attention to pressure ulcer as a significant health problem that impairs the patient's quality of life and puts an economic burden on the healthcare system.


