

## **Jordan University Hospital**

On 20 November 2025, Jordan University Hospital conducted a Pressure Ulcer Awareness Day as part of its ongoing commitment to patient safety and quality improvement.

The activity aimed to enhance staff awareness and clinical practice related to pressure ulcer prevention, early risk identification, and evidence-based management strategies. Educational sessions, in-service training, and practical demonstrations were provided to support best nursing practices and improve patient outcomes.

In parallel with this initiative, Jordan University Hospital established a dedicated intradisciplinary Pressure Ulcer Prevention, Follow-up, and Management Team. The team is responsible for ongoing patient monitoring, early detection of risk factors, staff education, and implementation of international best practices in pressure injury prevention and treatment.

This report documents the key activities, outcomes, and visual highlights of the day and reflects the hospital's commitment to continuous clinical improvement and patient-centred care.

As part of the STOP Pressure Ulcer Day initiative, Jordan University Hospital organized a comprehensive awareness and education event aimed at improving prevention and nursing care for pressure ulcers among healthcare staff.

The event opened with an educational lecture delivered by Dr. Mohammad Nassar from the University of Jordan in collaboration with Ghawar Company, titled "Pressure Ulcers – Prevention and Nursing Care", held at the Center of Education, Training and Continuous Development (8:30–10:00 AM). The session focused on risk assessment, early detection, and evidence-based nursing interventions.

In addition, the Nursing Department established a specialized multidisciplinary team dedicated to the prevention, monitoring, and management of pressure ulcers among hospitalized patients. The team is responsible for continuous skin assessment, early identification of high-risk patients, implementation of prevention protocols, and follow-up of outcomes to improve patient safety.

Following a break, an awareness exhibition was conducted in the Outpatient Clinics Building (Ground Floor) from 10:30 AM to 2:00 PM by the Wound Care & Diabetic Foot Team, Ghawar Company, and Arjo Company. Multiple educational booths provided demonstrations and printed material for staff and visitors.

A live demonstration was also organized in the Surgical ICU from 11:00 to 12:00 PM, where Arjo Company presented pressure ulcer prevention products and clinical applications.

The event successfully raised awareness, strengthened nursing knowledge, and promoted best practices in pressure injury prevention across departments.

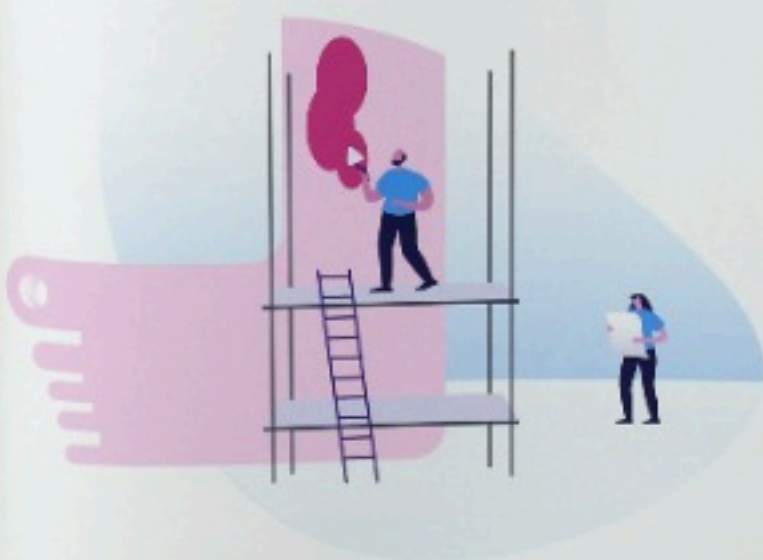
